Volunteer Hospice of Clallam County is a 501(c)3 non-profit charitable organization, whose service area stretches from Diamond Point to Joyce.

The mission of Volunteer Hospice of Clallam County is to provide physical, emotional and spiritual support to terminally ill patients and their families with free around the clock registered nursing availability and trained volunteers.

This support enables patients to live out their final days as fully and comfortably as possible. Ongoing grief support services are also offered to the families and anyone in the community who has experienced the death of a loved one.

Since its inception in 1978, all services have been provided free of charge to patients and their families; VHOCC does not bill any government agency for its services.

VHOCC during 2019

As we near the end of 2019, we, at VHOCC, have a lot to be grateful for and excited about.

In our 41st year of serving our community, we are providing palliative and hospice care to an average of 130 patients a month, which is an all-time high. We are looking to expand our nursing team to meet the growing need of care. In October, we welcomed our new Executive Director, Dr. JooRi Jun. The need for someone to take the helm has been underscored in recent years with the tremendous growth we experienced. Dr. Jun will work closely with the board to lead and guide the organization into its next chapter of growth, allowing for staff to focus on what they do best.

We are thrilled to report that we have moved into our new offices! Purchasing a space that is sufficient for our needs was made possible by a generous donation in 2015 from an anonymous donor who anticipated our need for a larger space and made it a condition of their donation. In addition, a grant from Mangan Fund, generous contributions of time by volunteers, and in-kind donations made renovations possible. Our new space can house a larger nursing team, an expanding volunteer base, enhanced community education and bereavement programs, and an ever-growing medical equipment lending closet. Please come visit us in our new space at the corner of East 8th and Race if you haven't already!

All this was made possible by your generous support, allowing us to meet the growing needs of the community. We cherish the opportunity to continue to make an impact. Great things are occurring at VHOCC because of your support. However you support us, please know you make a difference in the lives of those in our community.

This New Year's Day the Port Angeles Polar Bear Dip will celebrate 32 years of dipping and 8 years of fundraising for VHOCC.




Red Lion Hotel will provide hot drinks. VHOCC will offer muffins to all dippers and spectators, accept donations and round up valuable volunteers.
